Ordinance No. 2020-14

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 14  
OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF FAIRBURY OF 1982  
IN RELATION TO BEES

Whereas, the Municipal Code Book of the City of Fairbury was established in 1982, and

Whereas, there was a discussion at an all-committees meeting where it was determined that an ordinance should be passed that amends Chapter 14 of the Municipal Code to provide for more contemporary animal standards, and

Whereas, the Ordinance amending Chapter 14 was passed on April 17, 2019, and

Whereas, the City Council of the City of Fairbury are in agreement that bees should not be restricted as they are imperative in pollinating human food sources.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRBURY, LIVINGSTON COUNTY, ILLINOIS as follows:

SECTION I

Chapter 14, Section .26 shall be amended to read as follows:

**.26 KEEPING OF ANIMALS RESTRICTED**

It shall be unlawful for any person to own, use, keep within the city any of the following animals: pigeons, horses, cattle, sheep, goats, ponies, mules, pigs, swine, hogs, ducks, geese, minks, skunks, foxes, chinchillas, or any other livestock or poultry or any wild or vicious animal dangerous to mankind.

SECTION II

All ordinances or resolutions or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are to the extent of such conflict hereby repealed.

This ordinance shall be effective after passage by the City Council of the City of Fairbury, Illinois, and its approval by the Mayor of the City of Fairbury, Illinois, and its publication in pamphlet form as required by law.
